Please note; your ID documents must be in date and must have the same name as on your RCVS Student Declaration form that will be completed during your induction. If your details do not match or you are unable to provide supporting documentation (e.g. marriage certificate, deed poll certificate to show change of name) your documents will not be accepted.

- Original certificates of your academic qualifications. You must at least bring your GCSE (or equivalent) certificates with you.
